The major activity during February was the visit of the Ontario Command Service Officer, Patricia Royle to our Branch. These visits occur roughly quarterly. h. HOUSING – Comrade Garth Mader (Report submitted by Comrade Ken Green)

In January we had a flood which spread out of our control. Contacted the insurance company and got them into action to resolve the situation. Andrew McDonald from First On Site was assigned our situation. So far we have had the elevator suspended from work because the TSSA shut it down until it could be disinfected and the well painted.

In trying to determine the cause of the flood they had to cut into the floor in the power room for the elevator. They discovered that the hydraulic pump was installed on top of an access trap for the drain. That pump now has to be moved to the other side of that room. Once that is done the floor will be repaired and an access panel will be put in to access the drain.

Once that gets done they will replace the floor and repair the walls that were damaged during the flood. So far everything will be covered by the insurance. Andrew keeps me updated as to what is happening on a regular basis.

c. POPPY CHAIR – Comrade Wyn Fournier

1. In line with the approved budget, there have been Special Use Forms submitted and approved for the following:
 - a. Perley Rideau Veterans Residence: \$10,000.00
 - b. Ottawa MFRC: \$5,000.00
 - c. Project Healing Waters Canada (Fly Fishing for Vets): \$1,000.00
 - d. Calabogie Peaks Winter Sports Clinic for Vets: \$1,000.00
 - e. Army Cadet Corps #3018 Orleans: 8,500.00
 - f. Air Cadet Corps #632 Orleans: \$6,500.00

These organizations will be contacted to make arrangements to hand over the cheques in the next couple of weeks. The intent is to take pictures of the donations being received so that an article can be written for the Orleans Star. The desire is to show the people of Orleans, who have been so generous with their donations during the campaign, just what their donations are being used for.

2. The SUF for Wounded Warriors Healing Garden and Veterans Canada House, Ottawa were denied for the reason that these organizations were too similar to what the Legion already has in place. I will be placing a phone call to Ontario Command to clarify.
3. The SUF for the Ottawa Mission, Salvation Army, and Shepherds of Good Hope were suspended. I have been asked to get a letter from these organizations that outlines exactly how the money will be used for Vets as they are not Vet specific organizations. This may not be possible for these organizations to provide, and is an indication that Ontario Command is tightening up the requirements for use of Poppy Trust Fund money.
4. Initial planning for the 2019 Campaign has started. It is extremely important that the way the Poppy Trust Fund is administered is totally transparent to all Canadians, not just to the Legion Branch members. In order to have a solid volunteer team for the Campaign, the campaign must be well organized and the volunteers need to feel supported in their tasks. With this in mind, the Campaign this year will have the following updated items:
 - a. Better routes that allow for time and effort efficiency for Route Captains

- b. Addition of some new stores to accommodate new built up areas
 - c. Creation of physical maps that show the area we are responsible for in regards to Routes and Stores
 - d. Increased visibility through advertising early for volunteers and for the use of the campaign monies
 - e. Earlier solicitation for volunteers with the goal of having the positions all filled before the start of the campaign.
5. Anyone who is interested in being a part of the Captain team should contact me as soon as possible. I will need 11 Store Captains, 10 Route Captains, 3 School Coordinators, and a Retirement Home Coordinator. I am also looking for someone to assist me in the Chair duties specifically for the Campaign itself. A more formal request will be going out shortly via the email net and posters in the Legion.

Contact Team: Four (Mike Adams, Bob Elrick, Ken Green and Lucky Timmons) is now expanding our knowledge of and contact with the 13 Orleans Retirement and/or Care Residences. We and the residents would benefit from having a few volunteers, especially French speakers, join us.

2. Research Project

You might recall that some time ago Beatrice Crettenand Pecorini sent a message to Ray requesting assistance to identify candidates for her Master's program research project. Wanted were a few (limited to up to four by her supervisor, and then reduced to three) CF vets/francophone/over 70 years of age. They were to be interviewed extensively about their life experiences. That assistance on our part is now concluded to her great satisfaction.

Found separately by her - one 90+ years female at Perley.
Through our members - one 80+ male. (Could have been you, Ray!)
By me outside the Branch - one male 70+.

While this has no impact on the Branch per se, it does illustrate some of the extent of interest by young researchers in the collection of such information, and in measuring the impacts of the experience on contributors. The focus on Francophones has only to do with the language strengths of the researcher.



Motion #1 – Life Membership

Motion that after consideration of the criteria for the selection of members for a Life Membership Award set out in the RCL Ritual, Awards and Protocol Manual and the unanimous recommendation of the Awards Committee, that the nomination of Comrade Ray Plourde for the Lifetime Membership Award go forward on the appropriate application for the approval of Provincial Command.

Further Discussion:

Members may wish to note that there is another nomination for Life Membership which has the potential of going forward but more details of the outstanding services rendered to the Legion in the citation would have to be provided. Life Memberships have to be considered and approved by Provincial Command.

Motion #3 – Discussion on Women Warriors'

Situation: The Women Warriors' Healing Garden is a registered Canadian non-profit organization headquartered and operating in the Ottawa area. It is about one year old and offers therapy in the form of gardening and animal engagement. Last year much of their gardening facility was destroyed in the tornadoes and they are operating on a reduced capacity. (The web site womenwarriorshg.org provides

comprehensive information.) Their urgent financial need is to fully fund an animal-therapy activity involving the use of a mobile chicken coop to provide interaction with the birds, participation in their care, and production of eggs. Total cost is \$2000 and outstanding requirement is \$1500. Westboro Branch provided the other \$500.

Draft Motion: Given the program's purpose to provide self-help to female veterans and serving CF members suffering PTSD and other service-related mental health issues, its start-up status and its base in the NCR, and the urgency of implementing the chicken coop operation, it is moved that the Branch donate \$1000 to the organization.

Discussion: I believe that this an excellent example of motivated veterans taking concrete actions to help injured vets to cope with serious issues that so far escape the capability and/or capacity of more formal agencies. This could expand geographically and numerically to have a broad impact. It is supported by another Branch in the Zone and by another in Osgoode based on a personal involvement.

I have provided Jeff the contact info for him to approach to the Zone for potential coordinated action - ideally to support beyond funding. It is along the lines of the homeless veteran's focus now growing. Self-help. We could join in to help broaden local Branch's interests.

This is also perhaps a good case for us to develop an ongoing, multi-faceted volunteer operation to focus our veterans support attention on.

Joe is deeply involved in other support orgs such as the Navy League.
