I will still be taking care of the weekly broadcasts, so I won't be totally gone.

All items received have been forwarded to Senior Executive and updates sent to members via a branch email broadcast. All items have been stored on the off-site thumb drive.

7. PRESIDENT'S REPORT – Comrade Ken Green

Comrade Ken Green thanked everyone for all their assistance and help during his time as President.

8. TREASURER/FINANCIAL OFFICER REPORTS – Comrade Rita Pitre (Presented by Comrade Nancy Fisher)

This is the last meeting I will attend as the Treasurer so; I would like to thank all the Comrades I worked with, mainly Nicky, Mike, and Melanie with whom I had regular contact.

I also thank the Senior Executive under which I served. A special thank you goes to Joe McNulty who was so good at getting people involved for donations, grants and getting money for our coffers throughout the Covid-19 years. Marty, you were an essential person in getting through all those applications for grants and the bottle drive. Thank you to everyone who donated money or got involved as volunteer. We managed to stay afloat during Covid and pay down our commercial loan which now stand at \$140,000. You made my life a lot easier as Treasurer. Thank you!

This is the results for the month of April 2022. Due to Covid-19 we have little continuity or comparison in our Financial Statements.

We have a net income of \$6,900 with a year-to-date loss of (\$27,200). There is no longer any money coming in from the bottle drive and practically no donations. The bar operation provided us with a Gross Profit of \$12,100 and our Operating Expenses totaled \$17,400. We received \$10,000 from the Small Business Relief from the province, and it is the only reason we have a small profit.

Our cashflow is what makes this Legion a going concern, so it is a major factor and requires immediate attention.

Before signing off, I wish the new Treasurer, Nancy Fisher all the very best and assure her of my full cooperation in transferring duties.
